CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

Once again there is a lot going on and it is great to see so many people taking action to protect the village and try to make it an even greater place to live.

As I write this over 100 objections to Network Rail's application to create a maintenance yard and "operational railway" off Tynning Road have been logged on the BANES Planning website. Thanks to everyone who has made their feelings known. According to the website a decision is expected on Valentine's Day. Taking the time to respond is important in helping the BANES officers to understand the impact this application could have.

One other consultation, which appeared quietly on the BANES website, is with regard to the BANES subsidy of the night running of the number 265 bus route. The parish council have made a submission on how important the number 265 is to the village – particularly in the evenings and on Sundays when there is no other service. It is not at all clear what options BANES are considering – but if you feel this service is important make your views known at public_transport@bathnes.gov.uk. The consultation claims to close on 31 January but as BANES have made no effort to publicise it I would suggest submissions after that date should still be considered by officers.

Included in this newsletter is more about the great work being done on making our route to school safer. It is great to know how many children are walking to school – but this could be even more if parents' concerns about road safety around the canal bridge could be addressed. Find out how you can get involved in planning for a footbridge across the canal.

Whilst it is great to comment on the impact people can have by taking action to improve our village life it is also true that the burden often falls on a small number of people. Taking part in village life, whether it is as a school governor, a parish councillor or helping to run our village hall or village show, has many benefits. If you would like to get more involved with your community then there are many opportunities included in this newsletter and the accompanying leaflet from the village show committee.

We really need some new Parish Councillors. We currently only have 7 and we should have 9. A few more would just help us to spread the load. All we ask of a new councillor is that you can come to 11 meetings a year – which each take about 2 hours. You can then choose how much you want to get involved. If you are interested please talk to one of the councillors (numbers are at the end of the newsletter) or come along to a meeting at 7.30pm on the 3rd Thursday of the month in the small room at the Village Hall.

We are delighted that the parking charges have been removed from The George car park. Many thanks to Debbie Parry, the new manager. This is on the understanding that non pub users use the lower part of the car park and do not abuse the privilege. Also could I ask that anyone arranging an event where people might use the car park in greater numbers than usual, let Debbie know, and try to avoid the pub's busy times. We are also pleased that Debbie is keen to make The George a welcoming place for locals. See her invite to an open evening below.

Highways Group

There is imminent work planned along Mill Lane. Not only has the speed limit been lowered to 30 mph but work should soon start on a variety of measures to slow the traffic, to improve/widen the pavement to make it safer for pedestrians and to make the existing 'crossing' from The George to the churchyard clearer.

The Safe Routes to Schools scheme is increasingly active and looking at how the village can provide safer ways for the primary schoolchildren to get to and from school. The above-mentioned crossing from The George is useful for those driving to the village but for the majority of pupils who walk to school navigating the bridge over the canal safely is a real challenge.

Community Speedwatch continues to do sterling work and, as ever, thanks go to all the volunteers who operate the scheme.

The pavements seem to have been cleared of the autumnal leaves; the road surface at the bottom of Bathampton Lane and along the High Street is in a poor state with too much unsatisfactory patching. Most of the street lights throughout the village are now LED which provides cheaper and more controllable lighting. There remain a few which are still under the Parish Council's ownership; discussions are in progress to decide upon the way forward.

Planning and Conservation Report

Lin King and George

Ardrey Network Rail

The only significant Planning Application this quarter is the anticipated one from Network Rail. They acquired the field at the end of Tynning Road to use during the electrification process. When it was clear that this was no longer going ahead, we asked Planning Enforcement to look into whether NR should be winding down their current use of the field. Planning Enforcement agreed but were told that an application was imminent, and so decided that they would wait and respond to the application.

The application, number 17/06128/FUL, is for 'Change of use of the land to operational railway, incorporating creation of a railway maintenance yard and new highway access'. It is unclear exactly what this means, and the application is sketchy about many aspects, most particularly the traffic implications, which we assume will be larger vehicles and increased volume, causing an adverse effect on the village and especially the school.

The Parish Council has objected, and we have encouraged as many others as possible to look at the application and make their feelings clear. At the time of writing there are 110 objections as well as those from the statutory bodies. The closing date for comments has passed, but details of the application and comments can be seen on the BANES website.

Level Crossing

No further news regarding the new track through Jewson's Yard to take traffic to Bathampton Farm and allow the level crossing to be closed to traffic (but still open for pedestrians). We hope that negotiations will be concluded soon and the track opened.

The Bathampton Conker Crossing - Connecting the community with a cycle and footbridge over the canal

A group of parents from Bathampton Primary has come together to bring forward a planning application for a new bridge that would take pedestrians away from the humpback bridge over the canal. With the support of the school, parish and ward Councillors and King Edward's School, the bridge project is a next step in an 18-month dialogue with the Council and local organisations to establish and mitigate the road safety risks that families face when coming to school by bike and on foot and to promote sustainable travel.

Members of the Safer Routes to School Group, recently nominated for B&NES' 'Best Primary' for its travel planning, have established themselves as a new charitable association, The Bathampton Conker Crossing. They hope to be an early example of the community and council partnership working that B&NES has recently said will be a model going forward. The new cycle and footbridge will be sensitively designed to provide a new route for the whole community to enjoy. The group will hold a consultation event in the next couple of months to share the initial design work. The date will be advertised locally once confirmed.

To meet planning costs, the association has approached local organisations for financial contributions and is also crowdfunding. So far, the association has had offers of support including pro-bono work, reduced rates or funding from Format Engineers, LPC Trull Planning Consultants, Charlcombe Homes, Evolve Strategy, Entran Ltd and Bathampton Farm resident Mac Mckillop. Thanks to these contributions the maximum funds to be raised have been reduced to £27k, and we hope to reduce this further through discussion with other local organisations.

This 'community contribution' would help support the progress of the project. B&NES Highways team has indicated it would work with the community to explore available grants for the majority of the project cost. The project will require various consents to be secured, including Planning. In the event of a successful planning application and attracting funding, the parents group would look to work with the Parish Council and B&NES to deliver the new bridge.
